Thanks to the generosity of our donors, Our Spring which was mailed back in March, was a big succes goal of \$35,000, we ultimately exceeded it to raise \$42,000! And we couldn't have done it with your su

Funds raised benefited **Farm for ME** – a program piloted in 2013 that provides fresh vegetables for the Catholic Charities' Food Bank, which supports 23 food pantries in Aroostook County.

More than 200,000 people go hungry in Maine each year, and 61,000 are children. Nearly 25,000 Aroostook county residents depend on Catholic Charities each year for food.

This year Farm for ME grew by the bushels thanks to your support! We doubled our planting acreage and added six new crops – onions, kale, cabbage, carrots, tomatoes and blueberries - to our staple of beets, rutabagas and squash.

In 2013 we harvested 8,000 lbs. of vegetables and this year we've already harvested more than 4,500 lbs. of corn and 2,000 Ibs. of squash alone! We're currently in the midst of harvesting a bumper crop of rutabagas, beets and kale, in addition to our onions, carrots and tomatoes. We continue to work with Northern Girl, a micro processing company in Limestone, to flash-freeze some our harvest for distribution all year-round so families always have nutritious options at their table.

MAKING EVERY PENNY COUNT: Stories from the Field

Emergency Services program, *Relief and Hope,* operated by Parish Social Ministry

A single mother with a three-week-old baby calls Catholic Charities *Emergency Services Relief Fund* services seeking assistance with her car payment. She is six weeks behind, and it will be repossessed in one day if she does not come up with the payment. She uses the car to take her new daughter to Maine Medical Center several times a week in preparation for her upcoming surgery in Boston. Without the car she cannot make any of the appointments, which her daughter desperately needs. She supplements her limited income of TANF by selling items, but it is not enough and she has exhausted her family and friends for help. Her tax return is forthcoming, but was delayed. Thanks to the generosity of our donors, we were able to provide immediate hope and help through a payment toward the outstanding balance of the car loan and create lasting change by working with the car company to lower the ongoing monthly payment amount to something more affordable that fits within her monthly budget.



Our Emergency Services program, *Relief and Hope* is the beneficiary of our Fall Appeal now underway. We hope you have received a donation letter in the mail for consideration. This critical program enables CCM to provide help, hope and a hand to Maine families as they struggle to meet basic human needs like heat, food, clothing and even a place to live. Organizations Offering Hope through Grants & Donations

The CCM Food Bank in Aroostook County was a recent recipient of \$500 from the Maine Credit Union League. A check presentation was made on September 11th to commemorate those who lost their lives or a loved one during the national terrorist crisis of 2001 and to remember the daily hunger crisis so many families in Maine face. Since 1990, the Maine Credit Unions' *Campaign for Ending Hunger* has raised \$4.8 million to help end hunger in Maine.

The **SEARCH** (Seek Elderly Alone, Renew Courage and Hope) program was the recipient of a \$15,000 grant from the JTG Foundation. The funds will support program services that connect volunteers with seniors to meet their needs and ultimately help them feel less isolated while also remaining independent.

Jessie Albert Dental & Orthodontic Center received a grant of \$7,759 from the Davenport Trust. The funds help the Center invest in the latest technology and equipment and were used to purchase special equipment that helps clean/sterilize dental tools.

Our **Refugee and Immigration Services** program has been awarded a three-year grant totaling \$225,000 from the federal government to help promote health awareness, navigation and opportunities of health services to new Mainers in the Lewiston community.
