Topic: Being alert to frauds and cons.

Be alert when out and about:

- Carry your purse close to your body, not dangling by the straps.
- Don't carry credit cards you don't need or large amounts of cash.
- Use direct deposit for Social Security or other checks.
- Whether you are a driver or passenger in a vehicle, lock the doors.
- If someone or something makes you uneasy, trust your instincts and leave.

Watch out for Con Artists:

- Don't fall for anything that sounds too good to be true, i.e. free vacation, sweepstakes winner, cure for cancer or large investment scams.
- Never give your credit card, phone card, social security or back account number to anyone over the phone. It's illegal for telemarketers to ask for these numbers to verify a prize or gift.
- Don't let anyone rush you into signing anything! Read it carefully and have someone your trust take a look at it too.
- If you are suspicious, check it out with the police, others, or the Better Business Bureau.
